Woodstock College (September 23, 1869)

**July 3, 1634.** Andrew White baptizes the chief of the Piscatoway Indians, his wife, and his son.

**July 9, 1553.** The province of Brazil is established with 33 Jesuits.

**July 9, 1763.** The Society is expelled from Louisiana at the bidding of the French government.

**July 13, 1572.** The first Jesuit missionaries arrive in Mexico.



**July 14, 1979.** The assassination in Guyana of Bernard Darke, a photographer for the *Catholic Standard*, a diocesan newspaper.

**July 19, 1688.** The birth of Giuseppe Castiglione, a painter and missionary to China.

**July 20, 1944.** An abortive plot against Adolf Hitler results in the arrest and execution of Alfred Delp.

**July 31, 1926.** The New England Province is established.

**August 7, 1814.** The universal restoration of the Society of Jesus.



**August 12, 1877.** The death of Maurice Gailland of St. Mary's Mission in Kansas; he wrote a dictionary and grammar of the Potawatomi language.

**August 19, 1871.** The Portuguese government forces Jesuits to leave the city of Mação.



**August 25, 1666.** The death of John Adam Schall, astronomer and mathematician, in China.

**September 4, 1523.** Ignatius arrives in Jerusalem as a pilgrim.

**September 6, 1666.** The Great Fire of London breaks out; Jesuits are blamed. King Charles II banishes Jesuits from England.



**September 7, 1573.** The death of Princess Juana, Regent of Spain, the emperor's daughter. She dies as a Jesuit, having taken vows secretly under a special dispensation.

**September 23, 1869.** Woodstock College of the Sacred Heart opens in Maryland with 17 priests, 44 scholastics, and 16 brothers.

**September 24, 1987.** The assassination in South Lebanon of Andre Masse, assistant rector of St. Joseph's University.

**September 27, 1540.** Pope Paul III's *Regimini militantis Ecclesiae* establishes the Society of Jesus as a religious order.
