CALIFORNIA PROVINCE

Fr. Edward E. Callanan, 81, on June 10 in Los Gatos, Calif. He was principal at Brophy Prep in Phoenix and Jesuit High in Sacramento and pastor in Phoenix and Hollywood.

Fr. John B. Palm, 95, on September 8 in Los Gatos, Calif. He served for 56 years as a missionary in China and Taiwan.

CHICAGO PROVINCE

Fr. John D. Baggaly, 83, on September 2 in Clarkston, Mich. He taught at St. Mary of the Lake in Mundelein, Ill., the Gregorian University in Rome, and Loyola University Chicago.

Fr. James J. Donnelly, 80, on August 17 in Nepal. He taught in Nepal for 48 years at St. Xavier's School Jawalakhel and St. Xavier's School Godavari.

Fr. J. Richard VandeVelde, 74, on August 11 in Chicago. He taught math at Loyola University Chicago for 41 years, and he served as *Company* magazine's webmaster and business manager.

DETROIT PROVINCE

Fr. William F. King, 83, on August 20 in Royal Oak, Mich. He taught at St. Ignatius College Prep in Chicago, John Carroll University, and Xavier University.
